### Case Summary:

### Procedural Matters:

Anna Cuccia, Maria Ramires and Bernadette Delbart (jury members), Ben Kappelam, Pascal Rambeau and Gonalo PEREIRA DE CARVALHO (coaches) attended the hearing as observers.

NED 223131, NED 221350, ITA 217604 and SLO 220711 did not come to the hearing, the hearing proceeded in accordance with RRS 63.3(b).

Requests 23 and 29 do not identify the reasons for making the request for redress and are invalid.

All requests were made as soon as possible after learning the decision of the international jury in case 4.

### Facts Found:

1. Before the hearing for cases 16 to 30, the international jury reopened the hearing of case 4 and changed the decision to mitigate the effect of the decision on the boats in the Yellow fleet. Decision was posted at 23:08 on 13th March.
2. The international jury decision was: Redress given. Race 1 of the ILCA 6 red fleet is abandoned. However, the score for boats that finished in the first 12 positions in the abandoned race 1 shall be the better score between the initial abandoned race and the re-sailed race.
3. The jury considered that its decision may affect the series score of other boats.
4. The jury also considered the 12 boats that sailed the course without being affected by the moving mark.

### Conclusion & Rules:

1. When making its decision in case 4, the international jury made as fair an arrangement as possible for all boats affected, including the 12 boats that finished the race without the interference of the moving mark and the boats in the Yellow fleet.

2. There was neither an improper action nor omission of the international jury. Therefore, the requirements for redress in RRS 62.1(a) are not met.
