Conclusion & Rules: -

HUN 213119 outside overlapped at the zone failed to give SWE 219489 mark-room, and broke RRS 18.2(b).

SWE 219489 to windward failed to keep clear of HUN 213119 to leeward, and broke RRS 11. Since SWE 219489 broke RRS 11 and 14 while she was sailing within the mark-room to which she was entitled, she is exonerated under RRS 43.1(b) for this breach.

HUN 213119 did not avoid contact when it was reasonably possible, and broke RRS 14

It was not reasonably possible for SWE 219489, the boat sailing within the mark-room to which she was entitled, to avoid contact with HUN 213119 when it was clear that HUN 213119 was not giving mark-room. SWE 219489 did not break RRS 14.
